2009 Call for Nominations: AIBC Honourary Membership

AIBC Council welcomes nominations for Honourary Membership in the AIBC. This honorary designation recognized non-architects who have made an especially noteworthy contribution to the profession of architecture in British Columbia. A special committee is struck annually to review all nominations received, and to ensure they meet the specified criteria. Successful nominations are then forwarded for consideration at the AIBC Annual Meeting where registrants decide whether honorary membership shall be granted.

Criteria

- Consideration is given to those individuals whose contributions can be seen to have significantly advanced the development and standing of the profession.
- Areas of consideration may include innovation, education, publication, and public service.
- Contributions by way of design excellence or service to the AIBC must be exceptional.
- There are no limitations to the total number of honorary memberships awarded; however, to uphold its prestige it sparingly bestowed.
- While there is no age limit, the award must be hard-earned if it is to be valued. The shorter the career to the time of the nomination, the more outstanding the contribution necessary to warrant consideration.

Qualifications

The suitability of candidates should be reflected in the answers to the following questions:

- What is the nature of the outstanding contribution this person has made to either the understanding or the practice of architecture?
- What has this person done to demonstrably increased awareness and appreciation of the profession of architecture?
- What has this person done to demonstrate outstanding commitment and service to the AIBC?
- What are any additional, relevant and notable accomplishments of the nominee?
- Why do you think this person is an outstanding candidate for honorary membership?

Eligibility + Nomination Process

Award eligibility is open to both registrants and non-registrants of the AIBC, including those in related professions. The nominee, if an AIBC registrant, must be in good standing. Submissions should outline the nominee's suitability in as much detail as possible, including a biographical profile and nomination statement detailing the qualifications and accomplishments of the candidate (minimum 500 words).

The original nomination form, including the original signatures of five (5) supporting AIBC registrants, must be submitted in writing (*neither e-mail nor facsimile will be accepted*) along with the nominators' phone, fax, and e-mail contact information. Nominations must be in the possession of the Director of Administration & Human Resources **no later than 4:30 p.m. on March 18, 2009**, at the Architectural Institute of British Columbia, #100-440 Cambie Street, Vancouver, BC, V6B 2N5.
