2010 Call for Nominations: The Barbara Dalrymple Memorial Award for Community Service

The AIBC Volunteer Recognition Committee welcomes nominations for the Barbara Dalrymple Memorial Award for Community Service. This award was established in honour of former MAIBC Barbara Dalrymple, a prominent Vancouver architect with a strong commitment to her profession and the community. It recognizes lifetime or exceptional contributions made by an AIBC individual or firm registrant, in the spirit of Barbara's dedication to positive change and her legacy of professional and public service.

Criteria

Nomination must be made by an architectural colleague in concert with a community member or group with first-hand knowledge of the contribution(s) made. The award is not restricted to pro bono architectural service, and two types of community service may be considered:

- **Time-Limited Contribution:** For a significant, time-limited architecture/community related contribution, given to an identified geographical community, community of interest, or community issue.
- **Lifetime Contribution:** For sustained architecture/community-related service with one group, or for multiple contributions to identified communities and community groups over time.

Both types of award may include the following examples of community service in addition to others as deemed appropriate by the nominator(s) and jury:

- Research or education to benefit an identified community
- Contributions to an identified community's built environment
- Identity-building initiatives or cross-cultural relations
- Community revitalization or heritage preservation
- Urban planning or community development
- Elected or appointed public service
- Advocacy on behalf of community issues
- Contributions to community and professional associations

Eligibility & Nomination Process

Award eligibility is open to any AIBC member, associate or architectural firm. Eligible candidates may be nominated by another AIBC member or associate, and nomination may be made with the support of an external community group or representative with first-hand knowledge of the nominee's contribution. Submissions (which may be in binder form) should outline the nominee's contribution in as much detail as possible, including:

- a letter of support (minimum 500 words, maximum 1,000 words)
- supporting images on CD (minimum 300dpi in TIF format)
- project descriptions that support the nomination
- additional letters of support from third parties (i.e. former clients, community groups etc.)

The nomination package, including the nominator's original signature, must be submitted in writing (*neither e-mail nor facsimile will be accepted*) along with the nominator's phone, fax, and e-mail contact information. Nominations must be in the possession of the Director of Administration & Human Resources **no later than 4:30 p.m. on February 3, 2010**, at the Architectural Institute of British Columbia, #100-440 Cambie Street, Vancouver, BC, V6B 2N5. **Award to be presented at the annual AIBC Volunteer Recognition Luncheon on May 7, 2010.**
